Dear Neighborhood Resident,

You are invited to attend an online community meeting on Wednesday, June 1, 2022, at 6:00 PM, regarding recent and upcoming traffic calming work at the California Street/Dwight Way intersection.

The meeting will be hosted by City of Berkeley staff from the Public Works Department. The purposes of the meeting are to (a) confirm the effectiveness and layout of the recently-constructed temporary median in advance of the planned installation of a permanent concrete median in summer 2022 and (b) share pre- and post-construction traffic data for the intersection and adjacent streets.

Background

The City previously hosted a community on May 12, 2021, in which City staff provided background on the need for traffic calming and pedestrian and bicyclist safety improvements at the California Street/Dwight Way intersection and presented two conceptual alternatives. Based on community feedback, the City took an incremental approach to perform the work: in fall 2021, traffic counts were taken at the intersection and on adjacent streets; in late 2021, new sidewalks and curb ramps were constructed; and in March 2022, a temporary median was installed. Updated traffic counts were recently obtained, and City traffic engineers have analyzed the before- and after-data.
