Notes:			
A. Council Resolution 65,899–N.S. Establishes the Berkeley Tourism Business Improvement District. This assessment supports tourism in Berkeley by funding targeted marketing and promotional activities.			
B. Delinquent date is the last day of the month following the close of the reporting period.			
C. Penalties: If tax is not remitted by the delinquent date, add a penalty of 10% of the amount of the tax. If tax remains unpaid for a period of more than 30 days following the date upon which the remittance first became delinquent, add a second penalty of 10% of the amount of the tax.			
D. Interest: In addition to any penalties, add interest at the rate of 1% per month on the amount of the tax, from the date on which the tax first became delinquent to the date of payment.
